

I continue to believe that using the body rather than the arms is fundamental for all japanese traditional weapon arts. And I certainly shall put that concept back on the mat (or on the floor) in future seminars.

The attitude of the practitionners during that seminar has been exemplary, despite the rain of the first days and the overwhelming heat that followed. The teachers and I really appreciated it.

The evenings of the seminar were also quite appreciated. The group presentation showed that the European Jodo Federation was expanding through the whole continent.
