Report of the International Gasshuku in Broc 2012

The last day, a public Embu was organized on the football field. It was introduced by a speech pronounced by the vice-mayor from Broc which he even did in English! The farewell evening started with an Alphorn concert followed by a flag throwing demonstration. We then had "fondue moitié-moitié" (half-half fondue: half is "Gruyère" cheese, the other half is "vacherin fribourgeois" cheese) which is a traditional regional dish, followed by the not less traditional meringue and double cream, all

washed down with white wine from the Valais canton. Some of us (I do not mention the names) finished the evening quite late.

According to most of the participants, this was a very nice Gasshuku in a beautiful place like a real postcard.

The organizational team and myself have been very proud to welcome people from all over the world in our region.
